Trail Etiquette

Columbia River Basin was the homeland of Native American people for more than 10,000 years. The Treaty of 1855 ceded the lands to the federal government, but reserved tribal rights to hunt, fish, and collect plant foods on this land in the traditional ways. European-Americans began to settle here around 1861. Show respect for all people who have left evidence of their lives on and around the Columbia River. These remnants are the legacy of our country and the heritage of all people. For the safety and enjoyment of everyone, and to protect the trail, please follow these simple guidelines:

- + Non-motorized vehicles only.
- + Stay on the Trail. Shortcuts cause erosion and are harmful to plants and wildlife.
- + "Wheels Yield to Heels."
- + Keep right except to pass. Announce passing.
- + Safety helmets required for all bikers and skaters.
- + Do Not Litter. If you pack it in, pack it out.
- + Leave only footprints. Take pictures and memories only.
- + It is unlawful to pick or dig flowers, bushes or any other plants, or to carve or write on signs, trees, rocks or structures.
- + All pets must be under control and wastes properly disposed of.
- + Keep an Eye on Children.
- + Campfires Prohibited. Due to the danger of brush fires, campfires are allowed only in Irrigon and Boardman Marina Parks in designated fire pits.
- + Report injured animals to Oregon State Police Dispatch Center 922-5751.
- + Respect the privacy of adjacent homeowners.
- + It is illegal to disturb Native American archaeological remains.
- + It is illegal to deface a pictograph or petroglyph; use any instrument, even a stick to remove an artifact from the ground; dig for bottles, vandalize old buildings, dig or probe the ground for historic material.
